Perception Poll of Vote by Mail, In-Person Voting, etc

Conducted by Dr Silas Lee & Associates

- 1. A combined 62% have heard a little (45%) or nothing at all about legislation to allow vote by mail. Thirty-seven percent (37%) have heard a lot about the legislation
- 2. There is solid support to allow voters to cast their ballot by mail. Strongly support (55%), somewhat support (18%), probably not support (7%), definitely not support 16%
- 3. Nearly half (47%) of the voters do not anticipate voter fraud will increase, compared to 42% who expect fraud increasing
- 4. Having the option to vote by mail for president does not motivate 59% of the respondents
- 5. Respondents strongly support (52%) allowing any voter to vote by mail, but strongly oppose (38%) conducting all elections by mail
- 6. More than 7 of 10 (75%) voters strongly support allowing residents with compromised health conditions to vote by mail
- 7. Allowing no excuse absentee voting with the ability to go the polls is strongly (46%)/somewhat supported (14%)
- 8. Voting participation is expected to increase (62%) with vote by mail
- 9. A combined 51% strongly/somewhat agree requiring a witness to sign their ballot is an invasion of privacy
